- **Verily, verily, I say unto you, The servant is not greater than his lord; neither he that is sent greater than he that sent him. (John 13:16)**

SERVING THE MASTER

- He has shown you, O man, what is good; And what does the LORD require of you But to do justly, To love mercy, And to walk humbly with your God? (Micah 6:8)

WHAT DOES GOD WANT?

- GOD HAS SHOWN US WHAT IS GOOD. V.8
 - DO JUSTLY – DEMANDS ACTION
 - TO LOVE MERCY - ATTITUDE
 - WALK HUMBLY WITH YOUR GOD – HE MUST BE YOUR GOD

“DO JUSTLY”

- “JUSTLY”: TO GIVE ALL THEIR DUE
 - GIVE GOD HIS DUE
 - GIVE YOUR NEIGHBOR HIS DUE
 - GIVE YOURSELF YOUR DUE

PURE RELIGION

- Pure and undefiled religion before God and the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their trouble, and to keep oneself unspotted from the world. (James 1:27)

OTHERS & SELF

“LOVE MERCY”

- For I desire mercy and not sacrifice, And the knowledge of God more than burnt offerings.
(Hosea 6:6)
- For judgment is **without mercy to the one who has shown no mercy. Mercy triumphs** over judgment.
(James 2:13)
- "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you pay tithe of mint and anise and cummin, and have neglected the weightier matters of the law: justice and mercy and faith. These you ought to have done, without leaving the others undone.
(Matthew 23:23)

WALK HUMBLY WITH GOD

- This is the genealogy of Noah. Noah was a just man, perfect in his generations. Noah walked with God. (Genesis 6:9)
- By faith Noah, being divinely warned of things not yet seen, moved with godly fear, prepared an ark for the saving of his household, by which he condemned the world and became heir of the righteousness which is according to faith. (Hebrews 11:7)
