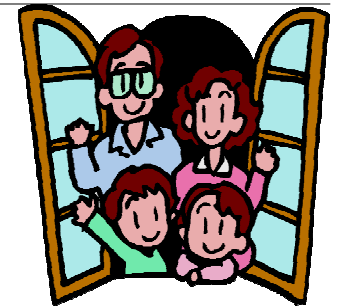

DEADLY DICTIONARY By Carl B. Garner

It takes less than a gram of poison in your food to bring about some very deadly results. That's 0.035 ounces or less—not much. It takes only a microscopic speck of dust on a computer chip to destroy its effectiveness. Just a very tiny deviation from the correct navigational course can cause the powerful spaceships to miss their objective by miles and miles. Just a little mistake can result in a gigantic blunder.

[A recent] news release illustrates this point in potentially hazardous circumstances. The venerable French publishing house, Larousse, has urgently issued a recall of the deadly 1991 *Petit Larousse* Dictionary. A deadly dictionary, you say? Seldom considered lethal, except when falling from a high shelf on one's unprotected head, this one is truly dangerous. How can it be dangerous, you ask? The answer is a simple one—the dictionary contains one erroneous detail among its 1700 pages. On page 203 of the latest edition is a color illustration showing fifteen varieties of mushrooms, including *Amanita Phalloides*, often called the deadliest mushroom in France. The mistake? There was supposed to be a red dot next to the picture of this deadly plant, indicating its potential danger if ingested. Instead, there is a black dot, indicating it is harmless and therefore edible.

A common French pastime is that of roaming through the French countryside forests sampling the varieties of mushrooms that grow wild therein. What authoritative source do they use for their information on which mushrooms are edible? The *Petit Larousse* Dictionary. Over a million copies are sold each year at a price of \$75 each. Think of it—one dot on one page given the wrong color. And people may die because of that error, if they are not made aware of the danger of believing that which is false.

The lesson for us is obvious. It doesn't take a great deal of error to cause a deadly result. Satan added only one three letter word to God's truth, thereby making a lie. Read Genesis 3:3-4 and compare the two statements. Only one seemingly-innocent statement in 1 Kings 13:18 brought about the death of the young prophet. Much of the religious doctrine that causes division and spiritual death today contains much truth. But just one deviation from truth, just the adding or subtracting of one word or phrase can change the entire meaning of what God has given to man for his guidance.

This is why we must carefully study our Bibles. This is why we must always compare that which we hear from men with God's inspired Word (Acts 17:11). This is why we need to be so careful in the use of translations that are careless with the Word of God. This is why elders are expected to use “sound doctrine” in stopping the mouths of those who would advance their own false views. This is why no one has the right to change one word of God's instruction for man. Because the results can be deadly, both now and in eternity.

“Ye shall not add unto the word which I commanded you, neither shall ye diminish ought from it, that ye may keep the commandments of the Lord your God which I commanded you.” (Deut. 4:2).

BOBBY LIDDELL WRITES...

Dear brethren:

On behalf of the faculty, staff, and students, we express greetings and our sincere desire that 2009 will be filled with joy, success, and blessings for you. By God's grace, and your help, MSOP has had a memorable and productive year in 2008.

Students. Counting the fifty full-time students in our two-year program, part-time students, those who take third-year classes, and those in our wives class, around one hundred students are being taught, each week, through MSOP, to be faithful, knowledgeable, productive, workers of the Lord.

Faculty. In 2008, B. J. Clarke was named Dean of Admissions, and Jerry L Martin, Dean of Students, received his Ph.D. in Marriage and Family Therapy.

Programs. In addition to the two-year program of preachers preparation, our third-year program of advanced instruction, and the class for wives, the annual lectures are a great time for learning God's Word and how to apply it, as well as a wonderful opportunity for fellowship. In 2008, we began Foundations, a week-long, annual, future preachers training camp for young men ages 13-18. It was a great success, with a capacity attendance of thirty.

Communication. MSOP's publication, Yokefellow, reaches into thousands of homes, with biblical articles and news from MSOP, and is now available by email. Our web page, msop.org, provides a wealth of information. In addition, the annual lectureship is available in book form, on CD and DVD, as well as podcast. Also, we send out thousands of letters, brochures, and informational DVDs, and we exhibit the MSOP display and materials at lectures, meetings, and other special events each year.

Facilities. The student housing, that we occupied in July 2007, cost \$3.5 million. In 2008, we were blessed to be able to reduce that debt to on \$230,000.

Evangelism. In 2008, our students conducted evangelistic campaigns in Ohio, Tennessee, Florida, and Mississippi, two in Louisiana, and two in Arkansas. They knocked on over 15,000 doors, and their efforts resulted in numerous conversions. Faculty members preached many hundreds of sermons in meetings, campaigns, and lectures across the states, as well as in several foreign countries, and on TV and radio.

We rejoice in serving God, and thank you for making 2008 a successful year! With you, we greatly anticipate the blessings, opportunities, and challenges of 2009.
