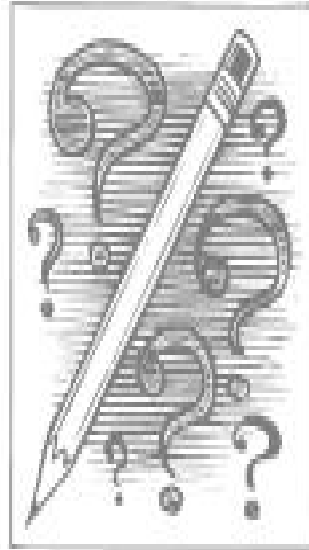

HIS NAME SHALL BE CALLED

Isaiah 9:6 is a Messianic prophecy full of information. The passage speaks of Christ coming and assuming the authority of divine government. The passage also lists four descriptive names that will reveal His character.

He will be the nation's **Wonderful** (this could be translated “exceptional” or “distinguished”). The concept though has to deal with the miraculous nature of His words and works (Matt. 7:28-29; John 7:46; 20:30-31).

He is also referred to as **Counselor**; the people will gladly listen to Him as the authoritative One. In Col. 2:3 it is stated that Christ possessed all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge. In the kingdom many people will be anxious to hear the Messiah teach God's way (2:3).

He is also the **Mighty God** (cf. 10:21). Some have suggested that this simply means “a godlike person” or hero. But Isaiah meant more than that, for he had already spoken of the Messiah doing what no other person had been able to do (9:2-5). Isaiah understood that the Messiah was to be God in some sense of the term. The Messiah would be deity in nature.

This Messiah will also be called the **Everlasting Father**. Many people are puzzled by this title because the Messiah, God's Son, is distinguished in the Godhead from God the Father. How can the Son be the Father?

Several things must be noted in this regard. First, the Messiah, being the second Person of the Godhead, is in His essence, God. Therefore He has all the attributes of God including eternalness. Since God is One (even though He exists in three Persons), the Messiah is God.

Second, the title “Everlasting Father” is a Hebrew idiom used to describe the Messiah's relationship to time, not His relationship to the other Members of the Godhead. The ASV footnote provides the alternate reading for “Everlasting Father” as “Father of Eternity.” What one is said to be the “father of” means he possesses the trait of which he is the “father of.” In this case, the Messiah would possess the trait of eternalness.

Lastly, Christ as the Messiah is also called the **Prince of Peace**. He is called such because through His “counsel” men can find peace with God, themselves, and one another.

Whereas those in Isaiah's day had to wait for this One to come, we today live after the Messiah has revealed Himself. Are we as appreciative as they were anticipative? What a Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, and Prince of Peace.
