## Living Memorials

Recently I was able to spend a week in the Washington D.C. area. I'm still amazed by how many different memorials I saw while I was there. You can walk through the National Mall and see memorials to Abraham Lincoln, George Washington or Martin Luther King, Jr. You can walk through memorials to the veterans from World War II, Vietnam or the Korean War. You can travel across the Potomac River to the Arlington National Cemetery and see the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier or the John F. Kennedy gravesite. We even made a trip to Gettysburg, PA where we saw hundreds of memorials to those men who gave their life in that three-day battle during the Civil War. Needless to say, we, as people, love honoring others with memorials.

This isn't just a recent development either. Even in the Bible we can see that memorials were important. God told the Israelites to build a memorial of stones when they crossed the Jordan into the Promised Land so that they would have a way to teach their children about those events (Joshua 4). Jacob set up a stone to remember the place in which he had a dream from God (Genesis 28). Even events like the Passover and the Lord's Supper were established as memorials. These things all serve to remind us of something significant from the past. As I mentioned above, we, as Christians, still use the Lord's Supper as a way to remember Christ and the sacrifice that he made for us ([1 Corinthians 11:23-34](#)). However, as I walked through the various memorials in Washington and saw the great attention that was given to different individuals from our history, I found myself wondering whether we, as Christians, have other memorials today that help us remember Christ and who he was. There's a passage in Galatians that would suggest there are many.

In [Galatians 2:20](#), Paul wrote, "I have been crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself up for me." According to Paul, when we become Christians the old-self dies and it is now Christ who lives within us. That means when people see us, they should be seeing Christ. Others should see our actions, attitude and teaching and see Christ living in us. In this way, we are each a living memorial to Christ. Through us, others should remember who Christ was and what He did.

In the same way that we would want a memorial in Washington to accurately reflect the memory of a certain individual, we, as Christians need to accurately reflect the person of Christ. Claiming to be a Christian but not living the way He did would be like building a memorial to Abraham Lincoln that remembered him for something someone else had done. To call ourselves Christians is to state that we will live a life that reflects who Christ was and what He did. Anything else would lead others to see Christ in the wrong way. When you walk through our nation's capitol, you may not see monuments of stone that remember the person of Christ. Instead, we as Christians get to be living memorials. We have died to our old-self and can now allow others to see Christ through us.

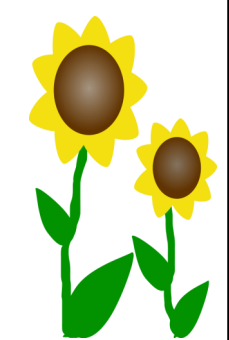
