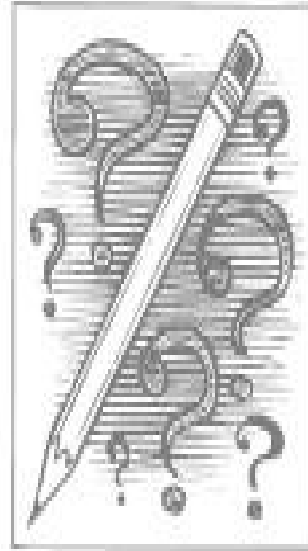

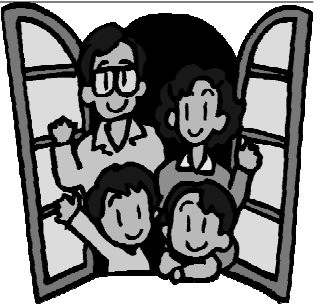

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO REALLY LOVE SOMEONE

This week's article is based upon some thoughts by Owen Solomon. Owen has been a faithful preacher of the Gospel for over 40 years. He brought me a sermon he had written recently and wanted me to preach it. I told him, if I did I would have to give him credit and then someone might say, “Hey aren't we paying you to work up your own sermons?” I told him I could use these thoughts though in the bulletin. I think they will be beneficial to all.

What does it mean to really love someone? We know there are numerous Greek words used for our English equivalent “love.” Sometimes what we call love is not love at all—it is nothing more than another expression of selfishness. Hopefully we would be more like “Big Brown's” co-owner. Big Brown had a great hope of being a Triple Crown Winner but he lost the Belmont. After the race his co-owner hugged the horse and said, “I wanted him to know that he could run dead last...and I still would love him.” Such an expression of love is unique indeed!

Owen lists a number of things that love means; consider some of the suggestions:

- 1) I love you means I will deny myself to your benefit (Gal. 5:13; 1 Jn. 3:16; 4:11; Matt. 20:20ff)
- 2) I love you means I will be your servant (Col. 3:13; Jn. 13:1-17).
- 3) I love you means I will readily forgive you time and again (Matt. 18:21ff).
- 4) I love you means I will be more impressed with the good of your person than the weakness (Rom. 12:21).
- 5) I love you means I will neither be jealous of your achievements, nor indifferent to your pains and sorrows (Rom. 12:15).
- 6) I love you means I will not choose to believe the worst I hear about you until I have confirmed or denied to me by you personally (I Cor. 13).

As Owen indicates we need to use the term “I love you” frequently but we also need to understand what we are saying when we express it to someone. I would add that God is a wonderful example to us of what it truly means to love someone—if we ever doubt just remember John 3:16.

Leon's Q & A

Question: How Can We Know That The Bible Is Really The Word Of God?

The Unit Of The Bible — Unity of Theme running throughout the text.

Unity of Doctrine — One God, Creation, Nature of man (Gen. 1:26; 2:7; Eccl. 12:7; Matt. 10:28; 1 Thess. 5:23), Blood (Gen. 4:4; Lev. 17:11; Matt. 26:28; Jno. 19:34).

Historical Credibility — Real persons, real events, real places. Flood: 250 and 300 flood accounts have been discovered. In the late 1800's, Sir William Ramsey, a scholar who was skeptical of the authenticity of the Book of Acts, set out upon an archaeological expedition in Asia Minor with the declared intention of disproving the historicity and accuracy of that book. After years of research, literally digging up evidence, he completely reversed his views. He became convinced that Luke had authored Acts. He wrote: "Luke's history is unsurpassed in respect of its trustworthiness...Luke is a historian of the first rank; not merely are his statements of fact trustworthy; he is possessed of the true historic sense...this author should be placed along with the very greatest of all historians" (Luke the Physician 177-179, 222).

Scientific accuracy — The earth is spherical in shape (Isa. 40:22). Suspended in space (Job 26:7). Paths in the seas (Psa. 8:8). The water cycle (Eccl. 1:7). The Bible and Biology—Life does not arise spontaneously (Acts 17:25). Living things reproduce according to the laws of heredity (Gen. 1:11,12,21,24). There is basic difference in the cell structure of the major classes of living things (1 Cor. 15:39). The Bible and medicine—Sanitation laws infer germs (Lev. 11:29-36; Deut. 23:12-14). Life is in the blood (Lev. 17:11). All nations share a common physical unity (Acts 17:26).

Christ's Character—Matt. 12:5-21. Betrayal, rejection, death, and resurrection.
