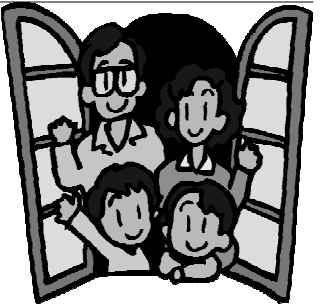

## PARENTAL GUIDANCE

I remember the day when the term “Parental Guidance” actually had more “teeth” to it. For example, I can remember going to the movie theater in East Liverpool, Ohio and trying to get into a movie that was rated PG. Our parents were not with us (we would have definitely not been allowed to see the movie). I remember being embarrassed as we were asked to show proof of our age. Of course we could not and guess what...they did not allow us into the movie! Boy, things sure have changed.

Today, many standards have been relaxed and sadly many parents have joined suit—they too have relaxed their guidance of their children. Could you imagine God being more concerned with whether “His children” liked Him rather than whether He provided the instruction and correction they needed? Can you imagine God being “more concerned” about being a friend to His children than a Father? I cannot fathom any of the above suggestions.

God who provides us with guidance has instructed those who are earthly parents to provide guidance to their children (Dt. 6; Ephesians 6; and much of the book of Proverbs). Sometimes like children, we do not like to heed what our Father tells us. But like children who fail to heed the godly instruction of earthly parents, when we fail to provide guidance to our children, we too will suffer consequences. Sadly the consequences often result in our own earthly children not being faithful to God. Let me word that another way—it often results in our children **being lost**. As harsh as that may sound, we need to be awakened to the reality.

Obviously all of us possess free will. Despite the efforts of a perfect Father (i.e. God) some people choose to turn away. So it is possible that parents can try their best to raise their children to follow God, only to see their children’s free will choice be to “not follow God.” But the purpose of this article is to remind all of us as parents to soberly examine our efforts to raise our children in the ways of the Lord.

This Sunday we celebrate Father’s Day. My challenge is to all fathers (and mothers)—examine your efforts to raise godly children. Take a step back and objectively examine your efforts. Before we know it our children will be grown and out from under our roof. Will our guidance of them provide them the best chance to be productive members of society? More importantly will our guidance and Christian example lead them to be followers of Christ.

In the fear of the LORD is strong confidence: and his children shall have a place of refuge (Proverbs 14:26). Godly fear casts out all fear of man and makes the believer confident and bold. (cf. Rom 8:31). Furthermore, “for his children there shall be a place of refuge.” The children of a godly person learn to trust in God from their father (14:26; Exod 20:6). As parents are our children learning the most important life lesson—’fear God and keep His commandments, for this is the whole of man’? If not, make the conscience decision to make a change today.
