## RESPONSIBILITY TO TEACH By Bart Johnson

*Hear, my son, your father's instruction, and forsake not your mother's teaching, for they are a graceful garland for your head and pendants for your neck. (Prov. 1:8-9).*

*Hear, O sons, a father's instruction, and be attentive, that you may gain insight, for I give you good precepts; do not forsake my teaching. When I was a son with my father, tender, the only one in the sight of my mother, he taught me and said to me, "Let your heart hold fast my words; keep my commandments, and live". (Prov. 4:1-4)*

*My son, keep your father's commandment, and forsake not your mother's teaching. Bind them on your heart always; tie them around your neck. When you walk, they will lead you; when you lie down, they will watch over you; and when you awake, they will talk with you. For the commandment is a lamp and the teaching a light, and the reproofs of discipline are the way of life. (Prov. 6:20-23).*

These words of God, found in the book of Proverbs teach us many valuable lessons. Not the least of which is that adults, particularly parents, have a grave responsibility to teach their children about God.
