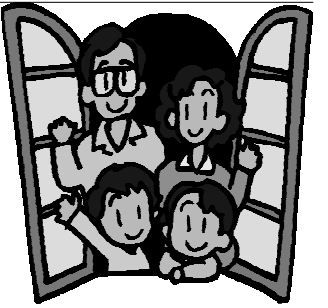

SLOW TO SPEAK By Steve Higginbotham

James tells us that the tongue has much to do with our relationship with God. Forget about all the good works we may perform, if we don't have our tongue under control, those good works are useless. James and our Lord made the following statements regarding the tongue:

“If anyone among you thinks he is religious, and does not bridle his tongue but deceives his own heart, this one's religion is useless...But I say to you that for every idle word men may speak, they will give account of it in the day of judgment. For by your words you will be justified, and by your words you will be condemned” (James 1:26; Matthew 12:26-27).

With such stern warnings concerning the use of our tongues, we would certainly do well to choose our words very carefully. Allow me to suggest three dangers regarding the use of our tongues.

It Is Wrong To Tell/Type That Which Is Not True.

We have an obligation to know that what we speak is the truth. If you are not sure about something, then would it not be best to refrain from speaking until you are sure? (Colossians 3:9; Revelation 21:8; 22:15).

It Is Wrong To Repeat That Which Is Not True.

This is what the Bible calls “tale bearing.” Often repeating a falsehood is done with the “justification” that “I'm just repeating what I've heard...” If you are not sure of the truthfulness of what you have been told, would it not be best if you did not repeat it until you were sure? Once our words are thrown to the wind, we can never recover them all. So be very careful that you do not mar another person's reputation. (Leviticus 19:16; Proverbs 26:20).

It Is Wrong To Receive That Which Is False.

You may recall that the young prophet lost his life, not for telling a lie, but receiving a lie (I Kings 13). Paul taught that we will be condemned for believing a lie (2 Thessalonians 2:11-12). A gossiping tongue cannot function without a receptive ear. Is it not sometimes amazing how some will accept a false, hurtful, and malicious rumor without so much as checking to see whether it is the truth?

As brethren, let us bend over backwards to be fair with each other. Let us think the best in one another, and give each other the benefit of the doubt until evidence is presented otherwise. We owe it to each other to ascertain the truth before we speak it, repeat it, or receive it.

Remember, our own salvation depends on how we use or misuse our tongues. Rather than using our tongues to communicate evil, let us use our tongues to communicate the amazing grace of God!
