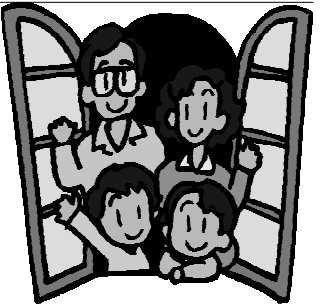

WITHOUT HOPE

There is a sad story that took place during World War II. A bomber crew was sent on a mission to strike a target in Italy. They took off from their base in Ben-Gahazi in Northern Africa. It was a secret mission, so they flew in the darkness of night. They had strict orders to maintain complete radio silence. The mission seemed to be doomed from the start. They were having problems with the instrument panel. The gauges were not working properly. They had to break radio silence. They were told to drop their bombs over the Mediterranean Sea and return to base. This they attempted to do, but with their gauges fouling up they could not find their way back to the base. When they began to run low on fuel, the pilot made an emergency belly-landing in the desert. They had overshot the base by five hundred miles. We know that all the crew survived the emergency landing because the captain kept a diary. The last entry in the diary read, “We are without hope.” It was eighteen years later before the crash site was discovered. There was still food and water on board the plane. Those men did not die because of lack of food and water; they died because they had lost all hope of being rescued.

Millions today have lost their way in sin. God has provided the means of rescue through the Gospel of Christ. The remedy is available to all. It seems that many are blind to their spiritual need and condition. Without Jesus and the forgiveness that He brings, they are doomed (2 Thess. 1:7-10). Paul described the Gentiles who were without Christ as being “without hope” (Eph 2:12). So many today live as if Jesus never lived, as if He never died, as if He never rose from the dead, and as if He is not returning to judge the world (1 Cor. 15:1-4; 2 Cor. 5:10). If they die in a lost condition, having ignored God’s plan of forgiveness, they will die “without hope.” The wrath to come will await them (2 Thess. 1:10). What is your present spiritual condition? Have you taken advantage of what Jesus has done for you? Surely, you do not want to die “without hope”!

What would we do without hope? It is an anchor of the soul, both sure and steadfast (Heb. 6:19). Hope grows out of faith. Faith provides the foundation for our hope (Heb 11:1). “...Gird up the loins of your mind, be sober, and hope to the end for the grace that is to be brought unto you at the revelation of Jesus Christ; that your faith and hope might be in God” (1 Pet. 1:13,21).

Note also the following passages: “Be of good courage, and He shall strengthen your heart, all ye that hope in the LORD” (Psa. 31:24). “The eye of the Lord is upon them that fear Him, upon them that hope in His mercy; Let thy mercy, Oh Lord, be upon us, according as we hope in thee” (Psa. 33:18,22). “Blessed is the man that trusteth in the Lord, and whose hope the Lord is” (Jer. 17:7). “That we through patience and comfort of the scriptures might have hope” (Rom. 15:4). “That being justified by His grace, we should be made heirs according to the hope of eternal life (Titus 3:7). The hope of the righteousness shall be gladness...” (Prov. 10:28). “The righteous has hope in his death” (Prov. 14:32).

In light of this article and a consideration of these passages, how will you answer the following passage? “Now, Lord, what wait I for? My hope is in thee” (Psa. 39:7).
